

**REGULAR MEETING, CEMETERY BOARD
THURSDAY, AUGUST 20, 2009
9:00 A.M.**

PRESENT: President Gray, Commissioners Blackler and Wellman, DPW Foreman Perkins

MINUTES

On the motion of Comm. Wellman, seconded by Comm. Blackler, it was resolved and unanimously carried (3-0 in favor) to approve the minutes of the meeting of May 21, 2009 as presented. The Board noted that they did not meet in June or July.

WOODCHUCKS

Pres. Gray reported that the problem with woodchucks in the cemetery has been taken care of.

LOT ADORNMENTS

Pres. Gray noted that there are quite a few solar lights and Sheppard hooks that are not placed tight to the stone making maintenance more difficult. Therefore, Cemetery workers should move them close to the stone and, if asked, explain that the placement expedites mowing.

Pres. Gray said he has also noticed that plastic flowers are out of hand again. The last time this happened Cemetery workers removed the plastic flowers and stored them in the shed for a while in case anyone wanted to claim them. The same should be done again. Pres. Gray said the rules stipulate no glass and only one pot per grave. Foreman Perkins said most people are good about following the rules. Comm. Blackler commented that she knows the rules clearly state no glass, but asked if the rules posted at the Cemetery actually say no plastic; she will review the Rules and Regulations.

As has been done in past years, Deputy Clerk/Treasurer Couch confirmed that she will again be putting an ad in the local newspapers reminding everyone to remove all urns and other containers by October 15th.

LAKE VIEW CEMETERY FEES SCHEDULE

Pres. Gray reported that there have been more requests for later burials and suggested revising the Lake View Cemetery Fee schedule to indicate that people need to be out of the cemetery by 4:30 p.m. Mon.-Fri. and by 2:30 on Saturdays and holidays. Comm. Blackler suggested changing the wording from "Double Marker Foundations" to "Flat Marker Foundations" as she and others were at a loss to explain what a double marker foundation is. Deputy Clerk/Treasurer Couch will make the revisions and review them with Account Clerk Shappell before distributing them to the funeral directors.
