Background

EPA's <u>Climate Pollution Reduction Grant</u> Program was created under the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022. The first phase of this program (the planning grant phase) offers states, large metropolitan areas, territories, and Indigenous Nations non-competitive funding to create climate action plans – the first being the Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP). States, municipalities, Indian Nations, and territories will be eligible to compete for \$4.6 billion in federal funding under the implementation phase of the CPRG program for programs, policies, measures, and projects included in the PCAP.

Scoping Plan to implement the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act, the State is now working to incorporate actions identified in recent engagement processes, among others, in the PCAP in collaboration with local government officials, disadvantaged communities, and Indigenous Nations. The PCAP aims to identify near-term, high-priority, and implementation-ready measures that will address climate pollution while supporting the creation of good jobs, lowering energy costs, addressing environmental injustices, and delivering cleaner air for communities.

These webinars are intended to gather detailed input from local governments on specific actions and measures to be included in the CPRG deliverables, particularly input on actions and measures that will be eligible for implementation funding.
